

1. The higher in the spinal column an injury occurs, the more function a person will lose.

- 2. Levels of SCIs
- a. Cervical C1-C8
- b. Thoracic T1-T12
- c. Lumber L1-L5
- d. Sacral S1-S5
- 3. Complete SCIs have no sensory or motor function below level of injury.
- 4. Incomplete SCIs have some messages that travel below the level of injury.
- 5. Average age at injury increased from 29 years in the 1970s to 43 since 2015.
- 6. 79% of new SCIs since 2015 are male.
- 7. 302,000 people with SCIs living in the US
- 8. The three leading causes for SCIs are 1) Vehicular injuries, 2) Falls, 3) Violence
- 9. 18,000 estimated new SCIs each year in the United States
- 10. Average caregiver pay through Medicaid is \$11-\$14/hour. Average out of pocket pay for a care give ris \$25-\$30/hour.
- 11.0 Family care homes in Iredell County or North Carolina
- 12. Average yearly expenses
- a. C1-C4: \$228,450
- b. C5-C8: \$140,144
- c. Paraplegia: \$84,934
- 13. 40% of adults with SCIs make less than \$25,000 a year
